Notice of Meadow Row Footpath Diversion Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that, the above-named order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 11th December 1989, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Mansfield District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running through land adjacent to Littleworth and Baums Lane, Mansfield shown by bold black dashes on the order map to an alternative route in the Baums Lane/Littleworth area, shown hatched red on the Order map.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of Mansfield District Council, Civic Centre, Chesterfield Road South, Mansfield, Nottinghamshire, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays. Copies of the map and Order may be purchased.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Central Administration and Legal Services, Mansfield District Council, Civic Centre, Chesterfield Road South, Mansfield, Notts, not later than 30th March 1990, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Mansfield District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the order as at unopposed. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

Park Slip West Rights of Way Application 1990

1. Notice is hereby given that the British Coal Corporation in connection with the working of coal by opencast operations propose to apply under section 15 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958 to the Secretary of State for an order suspending non-vehicular rights of way as described in the Schedule below.

If the District Council or County Council in whose area any part of the right of way lies objects and do not withdraw their objection the Secretary of State must arrange a public inquiry; if any other person objects and does not withdraw his objection he may arrange a public inquiry if he thinks fit.
