PEMBROKE DOCK, DYFED)
(RESTRICTED ROADS) ORDER 19

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under Sections 82 and 83 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to prohibit the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 30 mph in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice.
