MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Coity Road (Route A4061), Bridgend) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the side of lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.
