Stockholm, May 15. N. S. Two days ago a Yacht arrived here from Finland, with an Account fent by Captain Wrangel, Commander of a Swedish Frigat called the Wolgast, that on the 8th Instant two of our Galleys were fent to the Road of Abo, in order to discover the Posture of the Enemy theresbouts. Upon their arrival they perceived a great number of Boats, together with fix fmall Veifels lying at Anchor. As foon as the Muscovites obferved the two Galleys, they came out immediately with about eighty Boats well Mann'd with Soldiers and Rowers, and attack'd them with great Vigour on all Sides: But our Ships made a brave Defence till Night, when the noile of firing brought the Wolgast and another Frigat to their Assistance. Upon this addition of Force there ensued a very fharp Action, in which most of the Muscovite Boats were funk or taken. We have likewise made our selves Masters of the fix small Vessels, wherein was fome fome Ammunition, which has been fent to Admiral Watrang's Squadron at Hangud. In the Boats we took near Three hundred Prifoners, fome of whom are a ready brought to this Place, and have inform'd us, that the Muscovites have very few Troops about Abo, and that they have not yet made sufficient Preparations any where for a Descent into this Kirgdom.

Berlin, June 2. N. S. On the 28th past the King went to Brandenbourg, and yesterday he proceeded to Magdebourg, in order to review the Troops which are quarter'd in those Parts. His Majesty is expected here again very foon, and on the 28th he intends to fet out for Cleves. Baron Sparr is gone to confult with Count Welling at Hamburgh, upon Some Affairs relating to Sweden, after which he will return to this Place. Count Rothemburg, who accompanied him from France, is to refide here in Quality of the most Christian King's Minister to this Court. Monfieur Achenbach, who was Setretary of the Embaffy at Utrecht, is appointed to go to Petersbourg, in the room of Monfieur Slippenbach, who will be recalled very foon from thence. Mon-Tieur Dankelman, Prefident of the Regency of Magdebourg, has been suspended from his Employment, upon fome Complaints that were made of him by the Court of Hanover. Notwithstanding the Declaration which was lately read in the Churches, that for the future no Person should be prefs'd into the Service, the Levies are ftill carried on here in the fame manner as they were before.

Hamburgh, June 8. N. S. We are informed, that Monfieur Ducker, Governor of Straliund, has lately taken Eleven Dutch Vessels laden with Corn from Riga. He has likewife given Directions to the Swedish Captains to frize the Ships of any Nation whatever that come from the Countries con-quered by the Czar. Monfieur de Brofle, Envoy of King Augustus at the Court of Denmark, who was recalled by his Master, and was preparing to return home, has fince received Orders to continue at Copenhagen. Monfieur Goertz, a little before his departure from Berlin, presented a Memorial to the King of Prussia, fetting forth the Engagements his Majesty had entered into with the House of Gottorp, and defiring he would accordingly take effectual Measures to oblige the King of Denmark to reftore the Dutchies of Slefwick and Holftein to the Duke his Master; but his Frussian Majesty returned no Answer to this Memorial. It is faid, King Augustus has fent Orders to the Green Ge-neral of the Crown, to let the King of Sweden pais with his whole Retinue through Poland. Letters from Petersbourg, of the 15th path, bring an Ac-count, that the Czar's Fleet was fill detain'd by violent Winds in the Port of Cronllot. The fame Advices add, that Fifteen thousand Men were embark'd on board the Transport Ships, and Nine thou-fand on board the Men of War, which were ready to fet fail as foon as the Weather would permit.

Hanover, June 8. N. S. The Court is gone to pais the Summer at Herenhaufen. The Regiment of Foot-Guards has been review'd near this City in the Prefence of the Elector, who intends in like manner to review the reft of his Troops, and those which are at a distance, have receiv'd Orders to March hither for that purpose. Count Flemming and Count Wackerbart, Plenipotentiaries of King Augustus, are arrived at Brunswick, where the Conferences are not yet begun for Treating of a Peace in the North. They write from Petersbourg, that the Czar had lately Publish'd feveral Declarations, particularly one to establish the Birthrights of elder Sons, and another commanding all married Women, whose Husbands are ablent in Foreign Countries, to repair to the fame Places.

Hague, June 12. N. S. Yederday Monlieur de Chateauneuff, Ambailador of France, was in Conference with the Deputies of the States-General, on the Subject of the Treaty of Peace letween his Catholick Majefty and this Republick. The States have commanded their Plenipotentiaries to go immediately to Utrecht, in order to finich that Treaty; and the Marquis de Monteleone, Ambaifador of Spain, intends to fet out in a Day or two for the lame Place. Manfieur Nortwyck, Prefident of the States-General, was Yefterday in Conference with the Earl of Strafford, and this Day Monfieur Dalwigh, Minifler of Hefte, was with his Excellency, and delivered to him a Letter to the Queen from the Landgrave his Mafter. This Morning we receiv'd an account from Hanover, of the fudden Death of the Electrefs Dowager.
