*Liſbon*, June 12. *N. S.* On the 6th Inſtant the Queen was delivered of a Prince, whoſe Birth has been celebrated here three Nights ſucceſſively, with Illuminations, and other Marks of Joy. On the 10th, Mr. *Worſeley*, Envoy of Great Britain, had an Audience of the King, to Congratulate his Majeſty upon this occaſion. It is reported, that ſome Cruizers of *Salley* have taken three or four Barks belonging to this Place, on the Coaſts of *Portugal*.

*Hamburgb*, June 22. *N. S.* Some Days ago the King of *Denmark* arrived at *Frederickſtadt*, from whence he is expected to morrow at *Gottorp*. Eight Daniſh and two *Muſcovite* Men of War are ſet ſail from *Copenhagen*, in order to join the *Czar's* Fleet; but as they muſt neceſſarily paſs through the *Streights of Hungo Udda*, where *Vice-Admiral Watrang* is poſted with the *Swediſh Squadron* under his Command, it is thought we ſhall hear in a ſhort time of an Action in thoſe Parts. Count *Reventlau* has preſented a Memorial to the Emperor's Plenipotentiaries at *Brunſwick* on the part of the Duke of *Holſtein* his Maſter, deſiring he may be reſtored to the Poſſeſſion of his Dominions, and receive Satisfaction for the Injuries that have been done him. The Imperial Miniſters have communicated this Memorial to thoſe of *Denmark*, who intend to return an Answer to it in Writing. It is ſaid King *Auguſtus*, upon the repeated Inſtances of the Nobility of *Poland*, has at length conſented to withdraw part of his Forces out of that Kingdom. Count *Van der Nath*, General of the Troops of *Holſtein*, is embark'd at *Stralfund* for *Sweden*. Letters from *Coonſtat* bring an Account, that on the 31ſt paſt the *Czar* ſet ſail from thence with his whole Fleet. His Majeſty, before his departure from *Petersbourg*, had publiſhed an Ediſt to introduce the Cuſtom of England among his Subjects, in the Inheritance of Eſtates; and another to make younger Sons incapable of Purchaſing Lands, till they had ſerved ſeven Years in the Army. We are informed that the *Swedes* have lately taken four Dutch Veſſels laden with Ammunition for the *Muſcovite*



They write from Warsaw, that the King of Poland, and others of that Nation who have embraced the Interests of his Swedish Majesty, are already arrived in Poland. King Stanislaus is gone to Cronstadt in Transilvania. The Ambassadors of King Augustus and the Republick to the Ottoman Port, having finish'd their Negotiations with great Success, were set out from Constantinople, in order to return home.

Hague, June 26. N. S. Signor Grimani, late Ambassador of the Republick of Venice to Her Majesty, is arrived here from Great Britain, in his way to Italy. The Deputies appointed by their High Mightinesses to change the Magistrates in the Towns of the Spanish Netherlands, are gone to Brussels. Yesterday Monsieur de Chateaufort, Ambassador of France, was in Conference with the Deputies of the States General upon the Affairs of the North.
