Lisbon, June 12. N. S. On the 6th Instant the Queen was delivered of a Prince, whose Birth has been celebrated here three Nights fuccessively, with Illuminations, and other Marks of Joy. Hamburgh, June 22. N. S. Some Days ago the King of Denmark arrived at Frederickstadt, from whence he is expected to morrow at Gottorp. Eight Danish and two Muscovite Men of War are set sail from Copenhagen, in order to join the Czar's Fleet; but as they must necessiarily pass through the Streights of Hungo Udda, where Vice-Admiral Wattrang is posted with the Swedish Squadron under his Command, it is thought we shall hear in a short time of an Adion in those Pares. in a fhort time of an Action in those Parts. Count Reventlau has presented a Memorial to the Emperor's Plenipotentiaries at Brunswick on the part of the Duke of Holstein his Master, desiring he may be restored to the Possession of his Dominions, and receive Satisfaction for the Injuries that have been done him. The Imperial Ministers have communi-cated this Memorial to those of Denmark, who intend to return an Answer to it in Writing. It is faid King Augustus, upon the repeated Instances of the Nobility of Poland, has at length consented to withdraw part of his Forces out of that Kingdom. Count Van der Nath, General of the Troops of Holstein, is embark'd at Stralfund for Sweden. Letters from Coonstat bring an Account, that on the 31st past the Czar set sail from thence with his whole Fleet. His Majelly, before his departure from Petersbourg, had published an Edict to introduce the Custom of England among his Subjects, in the Inheritance of Estates; and another to make younger Sons incapable of Purchasing Lands, till they had served seven Years in the Army.
