Two Swedish Gentlemen, sent by Count Welling upon the same occasion, passed thro this Place a few Days ago. The King of Denmark continues still at Gottorp, but he intends to return very foon for Copenhagen. The Czar hath remitted a considerable sum of Money to his Danish Majesty, in order to enable him to fit out his Fleet. As foon as the Muscovites have received that Reinforcement, which confilts of Sixteen Men of War, they are to attack the Swedes. They write from Petersbourg, that the Princess of Muscovy was de-livered of a Daughter, and that the Prince, being indisposed, had resolved to go to the Waters of Carlsbad, for the recovery of his Health.
