**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984** 

The Trunk Road (A55) (Penmaenbach, Gwynedd) (Closure of Central Reserve Crossing) Order 1991

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which will come into force on 27th June 1991.

The effect of the Order is to close the gap in the central reserve situated opposite the junction of the trunk road with the access road to the Penmaenbach Youth Hostel, Penmaenbach, in the county of Gwynedd. The restriction is currently in force by virtue of the Trunk Road (A55) (Penmaenbach, Gwynedd) (Temporary Closure of Central Reserve Crossing) Order 1991, which will be revoked by the proposed Order.

A copy of the Order, a copy of the Order being revoked, together with a plan may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Aberconwy Borough Council, Town Hall, Llandudno, during a period of 6 weeks from 13th June 1991.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff, quoting ref. ZC 510-2-4-43.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) That it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or
- (b) That his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act,

he may, within 6 weeks of 13th June 1991, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order, or of any provision contained therein. (1 SI)

### HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The County Council of Gwent (Maesycwmmer-Newbridge Classified Road, Route A472) (Side Roads) Order 1990

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed (with modifications) the above Order which was made by the County Council of Gwent under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (a) to carry out the improvement of highways;
- (b) to stop-up highways;
- (c) to construct new highways;
- (d) to stop-up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises.

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council propose to construct between Maesycwmmer and Newbridge in the District of Rhymney Valley in the county of Mid Glamorgan and in the Borough of Islwyn in the Borough of Gwent and for transferring certain of the above-mentioned new highways to the highway authority specified therefore in the Order.

Copies of the Order, as confirmed and of the relevant plans may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours at the offices of Gwent County Council, County Hall, Cwmbran, Gwent; Islwyn Borough Council, Civic Centre, Pontllanfraith, Blackwood, Gwent; Rhymney Valley District Council, Ystrad Fawr, Ystrad Mynach, Hengoed, Mid Glamorgan; Newbridge Library, Church Road, Newbridge, Gwent (during hours of opening on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday), and at the Welsh Office, Legal Division, Cathays Park, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the ground that any requirements of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 27th June 1991, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein
