ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The Trunk Road (A40) (Sennybridge, Powys) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The general effect of the Order, which will come into force on 24th January 1992, is to amend the current prohibition of waiting on a 23 metre length on the northern side of the A40 Trunk Road adjacent to Sennybridge Post Office, to enable vehicles to wait for a period of not more than 30 minutes in any hour.

A copy of the Order and a plan, together with a copy of the Trunk Road (Sennybridge) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1965 which is revoked by the Order and re-enacted with the necessary amendments, may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Brecknock Borough Council, Council Offices, The Watton, Brecon, Powys.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

(a) that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or

(b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act.
