TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Stopping-up of Highways (Thornwell Farm, Chepstow, Gwent) Order 1992

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 248 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the stopping-up of the highways described in the Schedule to this notice to facilitate the movement of traffic on the main highway which is to be constructed with planning permission granted by Monmouth Borough Council on 10th May 1991.

The effect of the Order will be as described in notice 486 issue number 17426 of the *London Gazette* dated 14th November 1991.

The Order has been modified to exclude the stopping-up of a 20 metre length of Thornwell Road to the north of its junction with Somerset Way (South) which appeared in the original proposal, in order to facilitate the connecting of the main highway with Thornwell Road.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990; or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act;

he may within 6 weeks of the 30th April 1992 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The lengths of highway to be stopped-up are at Chepstow in the County of Gwent. They are shown by zebra hatching on the deposited plan and comprise:

1. that length of Thornwell Road, which extends from a point 20 metres south of the disused entrance to Thornwell Farm for a distance of 310 metres in a general northerly direction.
2. that length of Somerset Way (South) which extends from its junction with Thornwell Road, for a distance of 24 metres in a south-westerly direction.
