#### **HIGHWAYS ACT 1980**

The County Council of Norfolk (A1151 Wroxham/Hoveton Bypass, River Bure Bridge) Scheme 1988

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed without modifications the above Scheme which was made by the County Council of Norfolk under section 106(3) of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council to construct as part of the new highway which will bypass Wroxham and Hoveton a bridge over the navigable waters of the Bure River.

Copies of the Scheme (as confirmed) and of the relevant plan and specifications may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Norfolk County Council, County Hall, Martineau Lane, Norwich NR1 2DH, and at the offices of the Secretary of State for Transport, Eastern Regional Office, Heron House, 49-53 Goldington Road, Bedford MK40 3LL.

Any person aggrieved by the Scheme and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of any regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Scheme, may, within six weeks from the 1st July 1992 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Scheme or of any provision contained therein.
