#### **ROYAL MARRIAGES ACT 1772**

#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

#### **TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990**

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highways (County of Derbyshire) (No. 5) Order 1993" authorising the stopping-up of a length of non-classified County Road/Bridleway 44 Peak Forest and Footpaths 43A, 45 and 46 Peak Forest at Doveholes Quarry, Dale Road, Doveholes, B xton, Derbyshire.

The stopping-up is authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted to Staveley Lime Products Ltd by Derbyshire County Council on 6th October 1972 under ref. CHA/1271/23.

The Order will provide that the stopping-up must not be carried out until a new highways has been provided by RMC Roadstone Ltd to the reasonable satisfaction of the County Council.
