Genoa, June 18.

HIS Week arrived here the Marquis de los Balbafes, on a Galley belonging to this Republick, which was fent to receive him at Antihes. Another of our Galkies is gone to Marfeilles, there to take on b.ard Sig. Durazzo, who has been Envoy Extraordinary from this State to the Courts of Great Britain and France, and is daily expected here. Mr. D'Avenast, his Britannick Majeffy's Envoy to the great Duke of Tufcany, is arrived at Florence. Three Companies of Soldiers are returned hither from Final, being part of thofe employed in demolifhing the Fortifications there that Demolition is continued, the' flowly, for fear of damaifying the adjacent Houfes by blowing up the Works.

Vienna, June 19. The Emperour, the Emprefs, and the Elector of Trier, arrived yesterday at the Favorita, a Palace in our Suburbs, from a Journey which they had made for Devotion to Marenzell. The Frefents which their Imperial Majesties offered there at the Shrine of the Bleffed Virgin, were a Crofs of Silver and a golden Heart inriched with Diamonds; and his Electeral Highnefs gave a pair of Candlessicks of contiderable Value. The Government of Comorra, which became vacant by the Death of Prince Mansteld, is given to the Prince of Beveren. Count Traun, the chief Imperial Commitfioner at Presbourg, having delivered to the Dyet of the States of Hungary their Articles or Acts approved and figned by the Emperour, those States have depured the Cardinal of Saxe-Zeits and the Palatine Palfi, to make their Compliments of Thanks to bis Imperial Majefly. Count Trautsmanfdorff being made Prefident of the Chamber of Finances at Gravz, will 'tis fuppofed be foon recalled from his Ambasily in Swifferland. This Weeks a confiderable Sum of Mony has been fent to Hungary, to pay the Imperial Troops: Men are kept continually at Work in repairing and augmenting the Fortifications of Buda; and iome Regiments are ordered to advance into Tranfylvania.

Ratisbon, June 24. Count Metternich, the Son, has by the laft Post from Berlin received the Title of Privy-Gounfellour, and full Powers from the King of Prufia to be his Minister in the Electoral College, in the Room of his Father who is gone to the Court of Vienna. On the 21st the Ministers of the Dyer had again the Affair of Kehl and Philipsbourg under Deliberation, but did not bring it to a Conclusion.

Hambourg June 21. The Pruffian Troops appointed to affift in blocking up Wifmar, having marched on the 23d from Lentzen, have by this time joined the Danes who are to form that Blockade; the Number of those Pruffians is 6000. Yefterday arrived here two Ships from Holland, laden with Cannon-Bullets for the King of Prussia's Service, which are to be fent to Berlia and thence to Pomerania. 'Tis advifed from Copenhagen, that Vice-Admiral Sceffed is using all Diligence to get the Squadron fitted out and manned there, which is appointed to Sail to the Coaft of Pomerania, to affift in the Attack which 'tis fuppofed will be made on the life of Rugen, soon after the Junction of the Danish and Prufsian Armies, which 'tis reckoned will be within 8 That Squadron will confift of I Man of or 10 Days. War of the Line, 7 or 8 Frigates, 2 Bomb-Veffels, 2 Firefhips, and 4 Prames or large Flat-bottomed Boats, one of which is to carry 20 Guns, another 12, and a third 10, the fourth is to ferve only to carry Artillery or other Stores from on Board the Ships to Land. 'Tis faid that Admiral Rabe, who continues with 13 Men of War at Bornholm, will fee this Squadron to the Place where it is defigued to act. These Letters from Copenhagen ald, that Vice-Admiral Gabel's Return thither through the Sound was daily expected : 'Twas thought he would bring under his Convoy a good Number of Merchant-Ships from Norway; or that if they were not ready to come with him at a fhort Warning, he would leave 2 Men of War and 3 Frigates in the Categat to take Care of them. We have Advice, that the Duke of Mecklenbourg refufing to let the King of Denmark have Poffession of Rostock, where his Danish Majesty would keep his Magazines, has already formed a Garrigon there of 2000 Militia and 500 Men of regular Trobes, and fet 2000 Pealants to work upon the Fortifications; and his Highness scems determined to flatin Person in the Place to defend it.

Hrand July 2. The extraordinary Deputies from North-Holland, who arrived here the 26th paft, and have fince had fome Conferences with the ordinary Deputies of the States of Holland, concerning Means for regulating and fettling the Finances of the Province on fuch a Foot, as that the Arrears due to the Troops may pe paid and the publick Credit re-eftablifhed, are gone home, without bringing that Affair to a Conclution, having referred it to the next Softion of the States of the Province: In the mean time the Quarter of South Holland has confented to give two Months Pay, of 6 Weeks each Month, to the Troops which are on the Reparti-
