The QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

Whereas by the Suffragans Nomination Act 1888 it is enacted that, for the purposes of the Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth intituled "An Act for Nomination and Consecration of Suffragans within this Realm", such other Towns as Her Majesty The Queen may from time to time by Order in Council direct shall be taken and accepted for Sees of Bishops Suffragans as if they had been included in that Act, which shall be construed and have effect accordingly:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, under and by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Act of 1888, and all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and doth hereby direct, that the Towns of Ebbsfleet, and Richborough, in the Diocese of Canterbury and in the county of Kent and the Town of Beverley, in the Diocese of York and in the county of Humberside, shall be taken and accepted for Sees of Bishops Suffragans as if they had been included in the said Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth.
