Traffic Regulation Orders

Notice is hereby given that the Wigan Borough Council, in exercise of the powers under sections 82(2) and 83(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, proposes to make the following Orders:

Wigan Borough (Pemberton Road, Winstanley, Wigan) (Restricted Road) Order 1994

The effect of the Order will be to impose a speed limit of 30 miles per hour on Pemberton Road, Winstanley, between a point 15 metres south-west of the junction with Pine View for a distance of 65 metres in a south-westerly direction.

Wigan Borough (Shevington Lane, Aspinall Road and Arbour Lane, Standish) (Restricted Road) Order 1994

The effect of the Order will be to impose a speed limit of 30 miles per hour on the following roads:

Shevington Lane from Almond Road for a distance of 750 metres.
Arbour Lane from Almond Brook Road to Aspinall Road.
The whole length of Aspinall Road.

Traffic Regulation Orders

Notice is hereby given that Wigan Borough Council, in exercise of the powers under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby makes the following Orders:

The Wigan Borough (Ormskirk Road, Pemberton, Wigan) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 1993 (Amendment) Order 1994.

The effect of the Order will be to:

Revoke the Wigan Borough (Ormskirk Road, Pemberton, Wigan) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 1993, insofar as it introduced a prohibition of loading from the passageway between Nos. 729 and 731 Ormskirk Road for a distance of 30 metres in a westerly direction.

Introduce a restriction of loading on the north side of Ormskirk Road, from the passageway between Nos. 729 and 731 Ormskirk Road, for a distance of 30 metres in a westerly direction, to apply between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., and 4 p.m. to 6 p.m., on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The Wigan Borough (Wigan Lane, Wigan) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading/Unloading) Order 1994

The effect of the Order will be to introduce a prohibition of waiting and loading/unloading on:

Wigan Lane, west side from the junction with Bellingham Drive, to a point 10 metres south of the junction with Kingsmede.

Wigan Lane, east side from the junction with Bellingham Drive, to a point 20 metres north of the centre line of Kingsmede.

Wigan Lane, west side from a point 20 metres north of the exit to Christopher Home, to a point 20 metres south of the exit.

There will be limited exceptions permitting vehicles to wait:

- (a) to enable people to board or alight;
- (b) for the purpose of building and similar operations, removing obstructions to traffic, road works and works by statutory undertakers;
- (c) for local authority, North West Water Limited and Post Office purposes;
- (d) if the vehicles are fire service or police vehicles or ambulances;
- (e) to take on fuel, water or air at any garage.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS

BARROW IN FURNESS BOROUGH COUNCIL

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREA) ACT 1990

*The Council of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness
Barrow Island Conservation Area*

Notice is given under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Area) Act 1990, section 69 that the Borough Council of Barrow-in-Furness has determined that the area described in the Schedule to this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest and the character of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and has therefore designated this area as a conservation area.

The effect of the designation of the conservation area is as follows:

1. Conservation area consent will now be required for the demolition of all unlisted buildings (other than excepted buildings) in the area,
2. Planning applications for development which would in the opinion of the local planning authority affect the character or appearance of the conservation area must be given publicity and representations received as a result of the publicity must be taken into account in determining the application;
3. It becomes an offence subject to certain exceptions to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in the area except with the consent of the local planning authority;
4. The local planning authority are now under a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the area.

A map of the conservation area may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the local planning authority at the Town Hall, Barrow-in-Furness.
