TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of four areas of all-purpose highway at Orford Close, Great Yarmouth, Norfolk.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted to and by Great Yarmouth Borough Council on 3rd January 1997, under Ref. 06/06/0538/SU.

The proposed Order will require an improvement of Orford Close, Great Yarmouth, and the provision of new highway maintainable at the public expense for which Norfolk County Council will be the local highway authority.

Great Yarmouth Borough Council shall improve highway and provide new highway at Orford Close, Great Yarmouth, before the development is completed and the improved highway and new highway shall be highway maintainable at the public expense for which Norfolk Council will be the local highway authority.

Copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours during 28 days commencing on 17th June 1997, at the offices of Great Yarmouth Borough Council, Town Hall,
