Madrid, January 4.

Martinet's Squadron, which failed from Cadiz with a Commiffion to clear the South-Sea of Interlopers, has been forced by bad Weather into Malaga. Sig. Patino, late Intendant of Catalonia, is arrived here from Barcelona. The King defigns that he fhall have the Direction of Naval Affairs, and for that Purpofe has given him a Commiffion to go to refide at Cadiz, in the Quality of Super Intendant of the Marine and of Commerce. His Catholick Majefty has given Order for making a new Tariff, and regulating the Duties on foreign Goods, conformably to the laft Treaties; and the Governour of Cadiz has nominated one of each Nation of Foreign Merchants refiding there, to fettle the faid Tariff with the Royal Officers of the Cuftoms.

Vienna, Jan. 6. The Emperour is intirely recovered of his Indifpofition. Orders are iffued for the Recruits already raifed, and thole ftill raifing, to repair forthwith to the Places affigned them. Great Stores of Provifions and Ammunition are providing in the Places on our Frontiers neareft to Belgrade, in order to a Siege, which is defigned to be undertaken before the Enemy can come into the Field. By Letters from Tranfylvania we have Advice, that the Ottoman Port has appointed John Mauro Cordato to be Prince of Walachia, in the Room of his Brother Nicholas, who was made Prifoner at Buchoreft, and brought off from thence by the Imperialifts; but that he declines taking on him that Dignity; and that the Port has fignified to the principal Perfons of that Province, that powerful Succours fhall fpeedily be fent to expell the Imperialifts and cover the Country from future Incurfions.

the Country from future Incurfions. Berlin, Jan. 12. The King of Prufia goes to Morrow for Deflaw, where he will flay three or four Days, to hunt the wild Boar, with the Prince of Anhalt. 'Tis advifed from Warfaw, that the Polifh Army which is to be kept conftantly on foot by the New Regulation, is to confift of fix Regiments of Horfr,

Hambourg, Jan. 15. A Courier has brought Orders from the Czar to General Czeremetoff, to make a new Regulation of Contributions in the Dutchy of Mecklenbourg, by which the Country will be somewhat eased; for the inferiour Officers are to take but a fourth Part, and the chief Officers one Half, of what was before allowed them. General Czeremetoff has sent an Adjutant to Travemunde, with an Order to the Ruffian Troops to retire from thence; and some Letters advise, that they have retired accordingly, all but 60 Men, who will foon follow the reft into Mecklenbourg. 'Tis advifed from Copenhagen, that on the 5th Instant three Posts came in from Norway, with an Account that Commadore Tordenschild, with some of the Transports under his Convoy having on Board 1500 Men, was arrived pear Frederickstad : That General Budde had cauled feveral Redoubts to be made on the Frontiers towards Drontheim, by which 'twas judged that Side of the Country was fufficiently covered against any Attempts of the Swedes: That the News they had there of the King of Sweden was, that he was very intent upon reviewing his Troops in the feveral Places where they are quartered; and that he would not seturn to Lund till the Middle of January.

Parity

Paris, Jan. 16. Some Days ago a Cod-tier arrived with the Treaty of defensive Alliance between Great-Britain France and the State General of the United Pro. vinces, figned at the Hague. Yefterday the Regent dispatched Lieutenant General Dillon to Avignon, with an Order for the Pretender's speedy Departure out of the Kingdom; and four Gallies are ready at Mar-feilles to transport him, with his Retinue, to Italy. Baron Sparre, the Swedish Minif-ter at this Court, is preparing for his Audience of Leave.

- Hague, Jan. 19. We have Advice, that the King of Great-Britain intends to fet out this Day from Hanover, to be here on Sunday Night, and to proceed the next Day to Helvoetfluys, there to imbark for England. The Earl of Sunderland, the Lord Cadogan, and Mr. Seeretary Stanhope, will go from hence on Friday, in Order to meet His Majefty at Utrecht. The Czar had fent to Hanover, to defire an Interview with His Majesty on the Way near Utrecht, to which His Majesty confented ; but 'tis believed it will be prevented by the Czar's prefent Indisposition, which is very violent. Admiral Aylmer, and other Sea Officers who have been here some Days, will go to Morrow to Helvoetfluys, to fee every thing in Readinels against His Britannick Majefty's Arrival.

By the Commissioners for Taking, Examining, and Stating the Debts due to the Army.

Whereas by an Advertifement published in the Gazette on Tuesday the 11th of December last, Reciting that by AE of Parliament made in the first Year of King Fames the First, no Person or Persons shall fell, or cause to be felled, any Oaken Trees or Lopps of Trees meet to be Barked where Bark is worth 2 s. a Cart-Load over and above the Gharges of Barking and Felling (but in Bark Season only) upon Pain of Forfeiture of every such Oaken Tree fo felled, or double the Value thereof; And that if any Person or Persons shall fell any Oaken Trees, or cut any Lopps or Tops of Trees, contrary to the faid Statute, that they will be fued for the fame. Now for the preventing any Mistakes which may happen by means of this General Notice, as well as the Inconveniencies which may thereby be occasioned to His Majefty's Service in the Navy: It is thought fit to give Notice, That Oaken Timber fallen for the needful Building or Repairing of His Majefty's Houses or Ships is excepted by the faid Statute; and therefore Perfors who fiall fell or caufe to be felled Timber Trees for those Uses, though out of Barking Time, are not liable to be fued for the same.
