An humble Address of the Captain, Lieutenant, and Ensign, with the rest of the Company of Gentlemen Volunteers, associated under his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, within the Town and County of the Town of Nottingham, has been presented to His Majesty by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household.

An humble Address of the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, Deputy Lieutenants, Justices of the Peace, Gentlemen and Freeholders, met at the Assizes held for the County of Cornwall, the 25th of March, 1717, has been presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable the Earl of Radnor, Lord Lieutenant of the said County.

An humble Address of the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, Justices of the Peace, Gentry and Clergy of the County Palatine of Lancaster, has been presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable James Earl of Derby, Lord Lieutenant of the said County.

Hambourg, April 20. The Count de la Marcq, Envoy of France to the King of Sweden, who arrived here some Days ago, is wait-

ing for a Pass from the Court of Denmark, in order to his proceeding safely to Sweden; as also for Leave after his Arrival there to send his Dispatches over the Sound through the Danish Territories. A few Days ago, General Ranck, Minister of the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel, embarked at Lubeck to pass over to Sweden. Our Correspondence with that Kingdom being very irregular, the Letters from Stockholm of the 13th of February, and those of the 6th of March from the same Place, are but newly arrived together. Those of the former Date advise, that His Swedish Majesty, who was then at Lund, seemed to have newly resolved upon some Enterprize, having but a few Days before sent Order to the Colonels of all the Regiments in the Kingdom, except the Guards, to get into a Readiness to march upon the first Notice they should receive after the 19th of February, notwithstanding the Regiments of Cavalry which had so many Horses dismissed the Service at the Review in Schonem, had yet been supplied with but very few others. That his Majesty had also dispatched Orders to the Governors of the Maritime Provinces, to send away all the Seamen belonging to the Fleet at Carlscrona, and those belonging to the Squadron at Stockholm, to be ready to go on board their respective Ships by the 10th of March; and though it appeared extremely difficult to victual those Ships, in the Manner directed, by that Time, yet the utmost Diligence was used in it. That about the Beginning of February arrived at Malstrand 80 Swedish Officers, and 400 Soldiers, who were sent by Baron Gortz: That particularly there was among them a Lieutenant Colonel named Grub, sent by Baron Sparre, Ambassador of Sweden at the Court of France, with Letters; and likewise one Colonel During, with a large Packet from Baron Gortz; but the Contents of those Dispatches were kept secret, as was also the Enterprize for which the forementioned Preparations were making. These Advices add, that Baron Gortz was expected in Sweden about the End of February. Those of the 6th of March relate, that by a Gazette printed at Koninsberg, which came by a Ship from thence that arrived at Carlscrona, a few Days before, they had newly received the first Advice of the seizing of Count Gyldenborg at London; which Gazette was immediately sent to the King of Sweden, who continued, at Lund. We have no authentick Advices directly from Sweden later than the above-mentioned.

Dresden,

Dresden, April 14. The King of Poland arrived here on the 12th Instant, about 6 a Clock in the Evening, in five Days from Dantzick, accompanied only by Count Vicedom and M. Man-teuffel. His Majesty designs to set out to Mor-row for Torgow to see the Queen, and thence passing by Lichtemberg, the Residence of Ma-dame Royale, to proceed to the Fair of Leipfick. 'Tis advised from Torgow, that the Queen is something better at present, tho the Physicians apprehend her Illness may turn to a Dropsy. The Electoral Prince who has sent one of his Retinue hither, will not leave Venice before the Return of that Express from hence.

Copenhagen, April 17. On the 14th Instant sailed from this Port the Deal Castle, a British Man of War commanded by Captain Willis for England: 'Tis thought he will meet the Squa-dron commanded by Sir George Byng in the Cat-tegat. By four Deserters from Schonen we have an Account that the Seamen in Sweden have been all ordered to the Sea Ports. Three Days ago 10 Swedish Men of War from Carlscrona came into the Bay of Kiog, and still continued there. They have taken some Vessels bound hi-ther from Holstein with Provisions. 'Tis thought their chief Design is to secure the Passage of the Shipping which are employed to carry Provisions of all Sorts from Koningsberg and Dantzick to Carlscrona: And 'tis not doubted they will re-turñ into Port as soon as a Danish Squadron ap-pears in the Height of Dragoë, which by Reason of contrary Winds cannot be yet. There are now cruizing in the North Sea, under the Com-mand of the Danish Commodore Tordenfchild, 1 Man of War of 52 Guns and 1 of 50, 1 Fri-gate of 30 Guns, 1 of 28, 1 of 24, and 1 of 16, 1 Prahme, carrying 46 Guns and another of 24. In this Port are fitting out 19 Men of War of the Line, the least of them carrying 50 Guns; 15 of which Ships will be ready this Week to put to Sea; besides Frigates, Fire-ships, and Bomb Vessels. The last Advices from Norway say all his quiet there, the Swedes having retired into their own Country, and General Lut-zau having thereupon sent into Quarters the greatest Part of the Danish Forces in that Kingdom.
