##### ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

##### THE A16 TRUNK ROAD (MAIN ROAD, UTTERBY, LINCOLNSHIRE) (40 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 1999

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions, hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on a length of the A16 Trunk Road (Main Road) at Utterby in Lincolnshire. The effect of the Order would be to impose a 40 miles per hour speed limit on the length of the A16 between points 75 metres and 100 metres north-west of its junction with Chapel Lane. This would extend the length currently subject to a 40 miles per hour speed limit by 25 metres.

A copy of the proposed Order, together with an illustrative plan and a statement explaining the Secretary of State's reasons for the proposal, may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of East Lindsey District Council, Tedder Hall, Manby Park, Louth, Lincolnshire, at Utterby Stores and Post Office, Main Road, Utterby, Louth, Lincolnshire, or obtained by application to the Highways Agency, Network and Customer Services (Midland), Heron House, 49-53 Goldington Road, Bedford MK40 3LL, quoting Ref HA 28/2/36. Any person wishing to object to the proposed Order should write to the Highways Agency at the above address stating the grounds of objection not later than 2nd July 1999.
