#### ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

#### THE A585 TRUNK ROAD (FLEETWOOD ROAD, GREENHALGH) (EXTENSION TO THE 40 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT) ORDER

The Secretary of State for Transport gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Order if made as proposed will impose a 40 miles per hour speed limit on the A585 Trunk Road (Fleetwood Road) in the borough of Fylde in the county of Lancashire, from a point 46 metres south of its junction with Medlar Lane to a point 284 metres south of that same junction. A total distance of 238 metres.

The speed limit will not apply to vehicles being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire brigade or ambulance services or anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer in uniform.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan and the Secretary of State's statement of reasons for proposing to make this Order, have been deposited at Kirkham Library, Station Road, Kirkham, Preston, Lancashire PR4 2HD, where they may be inspected during normal opening hours (please note Kirkham Library is closed to the public on Tuesdays), or may be seen at or obtained by application to the Director, The Highways Agency, Traffic Operations, Room 908, City Tower, Piccadilly Plaza, Manchester M1 4BE.

### London Borough of Croydon

#### THE CROYDON (ON STREET PARKING PLACES) (LIMITED TIME) (NO 2) TRAFFIC ORDER 2004

1. Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Croydon on 13 December 2004, made the above mentioned Order under sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Croydon (On Street Parking Places) (Limited Time) (No 2) Traffic Order 2004, would be:

(a) to provide 10 "pay and display" parking bays so that they operate between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of Portland Road, South Norwood, specified in the Schedule to this notice;

(b) to limit the maximum period for waiting in a parking place to 1 hour;

(c) to provide that the charge for leaving a vehicle vary from 20p for fifteen minutes up to 80p (maximum) for 1 hour (maximum) with no return within two hours;

These proposals will make permanent existing experimental "pay and display" parking bays.

3. A copy of the Order which will come into operation on 20 December 2004, of the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order and of a map indicating the lengths of road to which the Order relates can be inspected until the expiration of a period of 6 months from the date on which this notice is published during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive at the "One Stop" Facility, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.

4. Copies of the Order may be obtained from Parking and Departmental Support Services, Environmental, Cultural and Sports Services, 1st Floor, Davis House, Robert Street, Croydon CR0 1QQ.

5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

#### TEMPORARY OFF-STREET CAR PARK IN CECIL ROAD

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Enfield propose to make The Enfield (Off-Street Parking Places) (Special Parking Area) (No 1 2001) (Amendment No ) Order 200 , under sections 35 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

1. The general effect of the Order would be to amend the Enfield (Off-Street Parking Places) (Special Parking Area) (No 1) Order 2001, so that a new charge for off-street car-park can be introduced in Cecil Road. (Note: the Order also contains a drafting amendment which reinforces the current practice that any parking ticket issued in an off-street car park would be valid on the day of issue only).

2. The car park would be operational on all days, 24 hours a day, although the charging period would be between 7.30 am and 6.30 pm on Mondays to Saturdays, excluding Christmas Day. Unless special arrangements are made with the Council, there would be a maximum period for which a vehicle could wait in the parking place.

3. The charges would be—up to 1 hour, £1; 1 hour to 2 hours, £1.50 and 2 hours to 3 hours, £2 and during the charging period there would be a 3 hour maximum parking period.

4. Vehicles that could use the parking place would be any motor vehicle constructed or adapted solely to carry not more than 12 passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and dual purpose and private and light goods vehicles of an unladen weight not exceeding 1,525 kilogrammes. All classes not to exceed 1.98 metres in height inclusive of any goods attached to the roof and/or 5.49 metres in length.
