Constantinople, November 16. O.S.

Efferday the Mulcovite Envoy M. Dafchof fet out from hence on his Return Home, making a publick Cavalcade through the Town. A Turkifh Aga is gone with him, to compliment the Czar upos the Renewal of the Peace between him and the Port, The two French Men of War which brought hither the Turkifh Ambaf fadour who was lately in France, failed from hence about 10 Days ago. The Venetian Bailo has not yet been with the Vizier, to make the Republick's Excufes for what paffed in the Affair of the Dulcignots; but expects to be called every Day, and he is to carry with him five and twenty Vefts of Velvet, Sattin, and Venetian Brocade, as Prefents for the Grand Signior; which is an additional Expence to the Republick, not flipulated by the Agreement, but demanded by the Turks as a conftant Practite on the like Occafions, to which the Bailo fubmits. A Perfian Ambaffadour is lately arrived here with a numerous Retinue, chiefly to return the Compliments made by a Turkifh one lately come back from that Country.

Stockholm, Dec. 6. Yefterday Morning the King and Queen of Sweden went to the Palace of Carlberg, where his Majefty dined and returned to Town in the Evening. But as foon as there falls a little Snow, it is faid the King will go and take the Divertion of Hunting for fix or eight Days at the Royal Seat of Grypfholm. The Commiffioners who were feveral Months ago appointed by the Chancery here, for examining into and giving Judgment upon the Elical's Charge against M. Hopken, who was Refident from this Court at that of Vienna, but left his Poft and came hither without Permiffion the Clofe of laft Year, have now finished that Examination, but have not yet pronounced their Sentence.

Laft Week arrived here two or three Imall. Veffels from Finland, with an Account of the Arrival theze of all the Troops fent, thither fince the Conclusion of the Peace with the Caar of Mulcovy; for though feveral of the Transport Ships were firanded in Stormy Weather, yet the Men on board them had all the good Fortune to cleape - But there is yet no News of Major-General Von' Effent who went from hence in October laft, to be Governour of the Province of Eaft-Bothnia; fo that it is feared he with the Ship that carried him is loft. Some Days ago the Grews of fix large, Dutch Ships baving been caft away near Helfingfors in their Way home from Peterbourg and Narva.

Naples, Dec. 19. Laft Week the Daughter of his Excellency the Prince of Borghele Viceroy of this Kingdom, fet out from hence for Rome, having been married here the Day before by Proxy to the Duke of Bracciano reliding there.

Lisbon, Dec. 25, N. S. Letters from Cadia of the 7th Inflant, N. S. bring Advice, that all Commerce was prohibited at that Place with Holland as well as with France : It is generally believed, that this Prohibition is occafioned by the groundlefs Report of the Plague having been brought into the Texel by the Durch Man of War faid to belong to Admiral Somelfdyke's Squadron, being the fame Ship which nor long ago caufed foma-Alarm in England. As the Conde de Aflumar, late Viceroy of the Rio de Janeiro, is preparing to return to Portugal, and in order thereto as obliged to adjuft his Accompts with his Succeffour 3 it is believed that the Fleet from thence may be later than ufual in coming Home, and cannot be expected in this Harbour till the End of the next Month.

Paris, Jan. 14. On the 10th Inftant the Duke of Chartres was taken ill of a Fever, which lasted almost 24 Hours, and for which he was bled the next Day; and having had fince another Fig. of it, he was bled for the fecond time time laft Nightiswhen his Fever continued ftill upon him. The whole Court is extreamly alarmed at this Accident. The Cardinal de Rohan will not arrive here till the 25th Inftant, by realon of his having ftopt feveral Dayr at Turin. It is affured that foon after his Arrival he will administer to the King the Sacrament of Confirmation. The Duke d'Offuna went on the 12th Inftant to the Palais Royal to take his Leave of the Cardinal du Bois; he defigns to fet out from hence for Spain in 8 or 10 Days. P. S. The Duke of Chartres refted pretty well laft Night; but his Fever continues ftill upon him, though not with much Violence.

Whitehall, Jan. 8. His Majefty has been pleafed to order Letters Patents to be pafied under the Great, Seal of Ireland, containing a Grant of the Dignity of a Baron of that Kingdom unto James O Hara, Eiq; eldeft Son, of the Right Honourable Charles Loid Tyrawley, by the Name, Stile and Title of Baron Killmaine of Killmaine in the County of Mayo in the faid Kingdom.
