Stockholm, December 23.

Yesterday the Senate adjourned their Deliberations till Monday the 11th of January. The King intends to go into the Country about 12 Leagues from hence, to take the Diversion of Hunting as soon as the Weather becomes any thing tolerable; but it has been for some Days very stormy and wet. The Queen has been for some Days confined to her Chamber by a violent Cold. To-Morrow the Court goes out of Mourning for the late King of Spain.

Copenhagen, Jan. 9, N. S. The Czar's Resident at this Court having received Orders from his Master, has notified to the King of Denmark that the Duke of Holstein is contracted to the Princess the Czar's Eldest Daughter.

Hague, Jan. 19. The States of Holland, who began their Session the 17th Instant, are taken up with examining the State of War for the ensuing Year that has been communicated to them by the States General, and with other Domestick Affairs. A Deputation from the said States to those of Zealand, is preparing to go thither within a few Days.
