The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day his Grace Charles Duke of Queensberry and Dover, and the Right Honourable Alexander Earl of Marchmont, were, by His Majesty's Command, Sworn Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took their Places at the Board accordingly.

Stockholm, May 18, O. S. On the 14th Instant in the Evening Sir Charles Wager returned on board the British Squadron at Elsenabb, having been entertained at Dinner by their Swedih Majesties on the 10th, by Count Horn on the 11th, by Count Gyllenborg on the 13th, and by the Count de Brancas the French Minister on the 14th. Mr. Poyntz and the Count de Brancas accompanied him on board that Night, and dined there the next Day with some Persons of Distinction from the Court, who came to pay their Respects to him. Sr Charles Wager will put to Sea from Elsenabb the first fair Wind.

Copenhagen, June 1, N. S. The Danish Squadron of Men of War, which sailed from hence the 25th past, put into Kioge Bay, and could not proceed from thence for want of Wind till the 30th, when they sailed for Bornholm. This Morning the Queen of Denmark was brought to bed of a Prince.

Hague, June 11, N. S. The States of the Province of Groningen have sent hither their Resolution, by which they consent to the Accession of the States General to the Treaty of Hanover, as five of the other Provinces had done before. The Marquess de St Philippe Ambassadour of Spain, returning hither last Night a little indisposed from Amsterdam, whither he went some Days ago with the Emperour's Envoy, died this Morning.
