Stockholm, May 18, O. S. On the 14th Inftant in the Evening Sir Charles Wager returned on board the British Squadron at Elfenabb, having been entertained at Dinner by their Swedilh Majefties on the 10th, by Count Horn on the 11th, by Count Gyllenborg on the 13th, and by the Count de Brancas the French Minister on the 14th.
