**A**T the Court at Kensington, the 4th Day of November 1726.

**P R E S E N T,**

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the Right Honourable Henry Lord Viscount Londale was by His Majesty's Command Sworn one of the Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the 10th Day of this Instant November, should be further prorogued to Thursday the 8th Day of December next.

*Lisbon, Oct. 26, N. S.* The 22d Instant being the King of Portugal's Birth Day, there was a great Appearance of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers at Court, to compliment his Majesty upon that Occasion. In the Evening a Serenata was to have been performed in the Palace, but it was put off on Account of his Majesty's being indisposed. The Infante Don Carlos is returned from Bellas, where he had passed some Part of the Summer for the Recovery of his Health. The six Dutch Men of War under the Command of Vice-Admiral Sommelydyk and Rear-Admiral Van Coperen are still here; but are preparing to sail for Holland in a few Days. Letters from Lagos give an Account, that Rear-Admiral Hopson, with the Squadron of his Britannick Majesty's Ships, lay off that Port the 16th Instant. The Dursley Galley sails in a few Days for Gibraltar; the Lyme, Lord Vere Beauclerc Commander, continues here.

*Dublin, Oct. 20.* This being the Anniverfary of His Majesty Coronation, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Vollics from the Regiments on Duty, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown-Green. At Noon the Lords Justices met at the Castle, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, and at Night a Play was given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies.
