*The Master, Wardens and Assistants of the Trinity-House of Deptford Strand do hereby give Notice, that they have Buoy'd the Channel of St. Nicholas Gatt anew with four Buoys: The North red Buoy of the Knowle, lies with Gullston Old Steeple, upon the North End of a Clump of Houses, called Mr. Tavanors-Houses: The white Northernmost Buoy of Corton Sand, lies exact with the Old Steeple upon the East End of the Jetty next the Pierhead: The Southernmost white Buoy upon the Hook of Corton Sand, lieth with Corton Steeple and Church, one upon another, bearing West from the white Buoy; And the South East black Buoy upon the South West End of the Ridge, lies with Carthy Steeple open of the South End of Lowstoft, about a Cables Length then the Town, bearing West South West; in going out, the two white Buoys upon Corton Sand must be left upon the Starboard Side; and the red Buoy of the Knowle, and the South East Buoy of the Ridge (which lie North West and South East above two Miles distant) upon the Larboard Side, keeping the Midway. The two outermost Buoys may be seen from the two first Buoys in clear Weather; and at Low Water there will be no less than three Fathom Water for three or four Casts at the first Entrance of the Channel, and afterwards four or five Fathom all the Way out in the Middle of the Channel.*
