Wardens and Affiftants of the Trinity-House of Deptford Strond do hereby give Notice, that they bave Buoy'd the Channel of St. Nicholas Gatt anew with four Buoys : The North red Buoy of the Knowle, lies with Goulfton Old Steeple, upon the North End of a Clump of Houses, called Mr. Tavanors-Houses: The white Northermost Buoy of Corton Sand, lies exact with the Old Steeple upon the Eaft End of the jetty next the Pierbead : The Southermost white Buoy upon the Hook of Corton Sand, lies with Corton Steeple and Church, one upon another, bearing Weft from the white Buoy; And the South Eaft black Buoy upon the South Weft End of the Ridge, lies with Carthy Steeple open of the South End of Low(ftoft, about a Cables Longth then the Town, bearing West South West ; in going out, the two white Buoys upon Coreon Sand muft be left upon the Starboard Side ; and the red Buoy of the Knowle, and the South Eaft Buoy of the Ridge (which lie North Woff and South Eaft above two Miles diffant) upon the Larboard Side, keeping the Midway. The two outer-most Buoys may be feen from the two first Buoys in clear Weather; and at Low Water there will be no lefs than three Fathem Water for three or four Caft at the fill Entrance of the Channel, and aftenwards four or five Fathom all the Way out in the Middle of the Channel.
