To the King's most Excellent Majesty,  
*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**W**E embrace this first Opportunity of our meeting together, to condole with your Majesty on the Death of your Royal Father, of glorious Memory, under whose auspicious Government we have enjoyed so many great and valuable Blessings, and of whose Royal Bounty, Countenance and Favour, we have had not a few signal Instances.

Deeply affected with this Loss, we adore the Providence of a wise and good God, who has raised your Majesty to the Throne of your Ancestors in so peaceful a Manner, and with that universal Joy which might justly be expected upon the Accession of a Prince, who is acknowledged to be the common Father of his People.

Nothing could so much alleviate our Grief for the Loss of so great a King, as the Succession of a Son, whose early Valour, prudent Counsels, and Love to the publick Good, render him so worthy to govern a free People; and whose known Attachment to the Protestant Cause endears him to all the sincere Lovers of true Religion and Liberty.

As we have a grateful Sense of the Goodness of Providence to us in advancing your Majesty's most illustrious Family to the Imperial Crown of these Realms, at a Time when all that was dear to us as Men and Christians had otherwise been in the greatest Danger; so we cannot but observe the Justice of the same All-wise Providence, in recompensing the Losses which your Royal Progenitors sustained by their firm Adherence to the Reform'd Interest.

This our Joy is increas'd by the Prospect of having these Blessings continued in your Majesty's Family, and your Royal Virtues transmitted with the Crown to your Posterity.

As we are inviolably attach'd to your Majesty's Family by Principle and Inclination; as the Preservation of our holy Religion, and all our Rights and Privileges, both sacred and Civil, do, under God, depend upon the Safety of your Majesty's Person, and Stability of your Government; so it shall ever be our Care to testify an unshaken Loyalty ourselves,
