HE following Address having been transmitted to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has by him been presented to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty, The humble Address of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen and Affistants of your Ma-jesty's City and Corporation of New-York in America, convened in Common-Council.

THE Loss of our late Sovereign your Maighty's Royal Father, of glorious Memory, made the deepest Impressions of Sorrow upon our Hearts. We were sensible that bleaven had deprived us of a Prince of most eminent Virtue and consummate Wisdom; and that to his Arms and Counfels we owed the Preservation of our Religion and our Liberties, when both were attacked by the most formidable Power in Europe. Your Majesty then (we most humbly hope) will conceive how great our Joy was, how much our Hearts were exalted, when we faw your Majesty, his Son and rightful Successor, advanced to the quiet and secure Posfellion of the Throne of your Ancestors, re-ceiving the earliest Proofs of the Assections of your loyal Nobility and Commons; the zealous Prayers of those Churches of which your Majesty is the Defender; and the glad Acclamations of a People devoting their Lives and Fortunes to your Majesty's Ser-

May it please your Majesty, though we are far removed from the happy Place of your Royal Residence, yet none of your Majesty's Dominions are more truly sensible of the Bleffings which all enjoy under the Adminifiration of a good, a great, and a just Prince.

We therefore most devoutly pray, that your Majesty may long reign over us; that your Royal Confort the Queen may be blessed with long Life, and a numerous Offspring; and that together with your Majesty's Person, your great and princely Virtues may for Ages to come continue to be truly represented in this your Majesty's Province.
