The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty in Council was this Day graciously pleased to deliver the Great Seal to the Right Honourable Charles Talbot, Esq; who was thereupon, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and likewise Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and accordingly took his Place at the Board.

*Paris, Dec. 5, N. S.* The Army on the Rhine being separated the 13th past, the Marshal Duke of Berwick went that Day to Strasbourg, and afterwards to Fort Louis and Huninghen, to see how the new Works which he had ordered to be made there were carried on: From thence he went to view Landau, and on the 29th returned to Versailles. Letters from Italy advise, that the King of Sardinia departing from Pavia with his Army, came to Malleo near Pizzighitone the 10th of last Month, and caused the Fort called Gerra d'Adda to be invested by a Detachment. On the 11th the Marshal de Villars arrived in the Camp. Some Days were spent in Preparations for the Siege of the said Fort, and in laying over the Adda Bridges of Communication with the Troops lying on the other Side of that River before Pizzighitone. The Night between the 17th and 18th the Trenches were opened against Gerra d'Adda, and the Approaches being made regularly till the Night between the 23d and 24th, the King of Sardinia ordered the Cover'd-Way of that Fort to be attacked, and the Besiegers were driven out of it, Three of our Captains of Granadiers being killed or wounded, 20 Men killed and 110 wounded.

Yesterday His Majesty was pleased to constitute and appoint, by Commission under the Great Seal, John Willes, Esq; to be His Attorney General; and also Dudley Rider, Esq; to be His Solicitor General.

His Majesty has likewise been pleased to grant to the said John Willes, Esq; Precedency in all His Majesty's Courts of Justice, during his Life, next after the Attorney General of His Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors.

*Whitehall, Nov. 28, 1733.*

Whereas on Monday the 5th of this Instant November, Christopher Best, one of the Peace Officers of the Hamlet of Mile-End Old-Town, in the Parish of Stepney, in the County of Middlesex, with Mathew Davis, a Watchman, going their Rounds about Three of the Clock in the Morning, were violently assaulted by Four Persons, (to whom they gave no Provocation) who cut the said Christopher Best over the Head in divers Places

with a Hanger, and a Pistol being fired at the same Time, shot the said Mathew Davis into the Head, of which Wound he died about Thirty Hours after: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
