*Hague, Jan. 27, N. S.* The States of Holland ſeparated to Day, without having brought to a Concluſion the Affair of repairing the Digues. Count Uhlefeld ſet out from hence laſt Night for Bruffels, to meet Count Kinsky and his Lady, who are expected there to Morrow, and are to proceed for England by the Way of Calais. We have an Account from Leuwarden, that a Fire having broke out in an Houſe near the Prince of Orange's Palace, their Royal and Serene Highneſſes were obliged to quit it in a great Hurry: But Means being timely uſed, the Fire was ſtopt from ſpreading.
