The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the Right Honourable John Lord Monson, and the Right Honourable Sir William Lee, Kt. Lord Chief Justice of his Majesty's Court of King's Bench, were, by his Majesty's Command, sworn of his Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective Places at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Augustus Earl of Berkeley, to be Lord Lieutenant of the Gounty of Gloucester, the City of Bristol and County of the same, and City of Gloucester and County of the same, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the Fourth of August next, should be surther prorogued to Thursday the 20th Day of October following.

Vienna, July 13, N. S. Marshal Seckendors, by Letters dated the 5th Instant from Lipoda, advises, that he was but five Days March from a little Village called Rezna, which belongs to the Turks; but that as he intended to let his Army rest three or sour Days, he did not design to some to that Village before the 12th Instant in the Morning; that his Army was in a very good Condition,

and notwithstanding the great Heats, there were very few fick. It is still supposed Nissa may be invested about the 20th Instant; and as the Turks had imagined that Widdin would be besieged first, it is said they have not made so much Provision for the Preservation of the Town of Nissa, as they have done for Widdin. Prince Hildburgshausen marches with the separate Body he commands towards a Place called Bagnialuka, a small Town which is the Residence of the Basha of Bosnia; but it is faid here, that he is to undertake no Siege before Count Seckendorf can make a true Judgment as to the Success of that of Nissa. Count Wallis is likewise on the March towards Wallachia, though in a Manner to be as near at Hand to the great Army as possible, in order to join that Army, if the Grand Vizier should either send or come himfelf with a confiderable Body against Count Seckendors. A Courier came Yesterday from Ratisbon, with Advice, that his Royal High-ness the Duke of Lorrain has been elected Marshal of the Empire by the Diet, Nemine contradicente.

Dresden, July 17, N. S. The King arrived here from Fraustadt the 15th Instant, having finished to his Satisfaction the Senatus Consistem, and granted the Diploma or Letters Patent confirming the Election of Count Biron to the Dutchy of Courland? His Majesty has likewise given Instructions for all things that are to be regulated by his Commissioners and the Plenipotentiaries to be appointed by the new Duke; and it is thought that Dantzick will be the Place where they will chuse to meet for that Purpose. The Turkish Ambassadour was admitted the 11th Instant to a publick Audience in the Senate at Fraustadt, and was to go to Warsaw, from whence he proposed to resum

in a little Time to his own Country ! He ! received confiderable Presents from the King. The Congress to treat of Peace between the Turks and Russians, is fixed at Niemerow, at the Defire of the Palatin of Kioyia, to whom that Place belongs; the Russians have confented to it 5-and the Republick of Poland will lend thither a Minister to take Care of its Interest. M. Senex, who was sent to do Homage to the King in the Name of Count Biron, has not as yet had Audience.

Berlin, July 20, N. S. It is advised from Pomerania, that several Promotions have been made there by his Prussian Majesty amongst his Officers, the chief of which are, General Gromkow and General Borck, to be Field Marshals of his Armies; and the Margrave of Swedt, who was a Major General, to be a Lieutenant General. The King of Prusfla, and all those who attended him in this Journey, are expected in Town about Wednesday or Thursday next.

Copenhagen, July 20, N. S. The Danish Court removed Yesterday from Friedensburg to Fridericksburg, and the Margravine went along with it; but as she has fent for a Physician from Town, it is believed that her Re-

covery is not yet well assured.
