The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the Right Hon. John Verney, Elq; Master of the Rolls, was by his Majesty's Command fworn of his Majefty's moft Ho-nourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Friday the Thirteenth of this Instant October, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Seventh Day of December next.

Vienna, Oct. 8, N. S. Letters from Belgrade of the 1st Instant relate, that Count Konigleg having Advice that about 15000 Turks had appeared near Meadia, and that another Party had entred the Bannat by Vir palanka, he passed the Danube on the 27th of last Month with the Imperial Cavalry, and marched as far as Panchova ; but having Intelligence there that the Enemy had retired, he repassed the Danube and the Save on the 28th, and returned to the Camp at Semlin. Felt Marshal Wallis is very ill of a Fever at Belgrade, and there are no less than 400 Of-ficers, of one Rank or other, fick at the Army, or abfent from it on Account of Sick-nefs. 'I'he repairing and augmenting the Fortifications of Belgrade, were carried on with the greateft Diligence ; for fince the 18th of Sep-tember to the 1ft Inftant, 1500 Men at a time-had been conftantly at Work. Other Letters from Belgrade of the 4th Instant advise, that Colonel Count Comberg the late Governour of Orfova, dying at Belgrade, was interr'd there that Day, with the ufual military Ho-nours. The Prince of Hildesburghaufen was ordered to go and receive the auxiliary Saxon and Bavarian Troops at Reterwaradin. Thele Letters add, that Count Koniglegg deligned to pass the Danube again, in order to which

'T the Court at Kenfington, the 12th Day he had directed the laying a new Bridge of October, 1738. higher up the Danube in the Neighbourhood of Salankement; and that 13 Battallions of 500 Men each, and a Company of 60 Grena-diers out of every Regiment, marched on the 4th out of Belgrade, croß'd the Save, and repair'd to the Camp at Semlin; where Felt-Marshal Kevenhuller was daily expected, to take on him the Command of the Cavalry. There is certain Advice of the Grand Vizier's being gone to Constantinople, and that the Turkish Army he commanded is separated. On Monday the 6th Inftant, about Ten a-Clock in the Morning, the Grand Dutchels of Tulcany was fafely deliver'd of a Princefs.

David Roberts, by Trade a Carpenter, about 5 Foot S or 9 Inthes high, of a fairi /h freih Complexion, about 35 Tears of Age, who kept the Coach and Ho fes Inn in the City of Coventry about two Years ago, fince lodged in Cold Bash Fields, London, afterwards at one Williams, a Chandler on Saffron Hill, afterwards moved and kept a Houfe in the Market-place, Hoxton, from thence mo-wed to the Broad Santtuary, Wefininster, from thence to the Mulberry Garden in St. George's Fields, Southwark, from thence to Wood's Close near Clerkenwell, his last Habitation was near the Three Hats, Isington.

Joseph Benson, about 3 Foot 6 Inches high, besween 60 and 70 Tears old, stoops a little, wears a Wig, and bis Hair presty long under it, and is a thin Spare Man, born near Naresboiough in Yorkflire, by Trade a Gunfinish, noted for making Crofs Bows, formerly lived in Dublin; bis last Place of Habitation was at Cats-Hole in St. Catherine's, near the Tower. N. B. Joseph Benfon is the Maker of the Engine lately found in the New Rever, and bas made feveral Engines for m lling the Guincas, and is reckoned by the Gunsmiths an ingenious Man at his Busines.
