Drefden; Jan. 7, N. S. Prince Lobcowitz having in his Difpolition at Teutch Brod taken all the Advantages of the Situation of the Place, the Chevalier de Saxe thought it impossible to force him, and therefore endeavoured to draw him from it, by advancing his Army a little on the Left towards Polna, imagining that fuch a Motion might make the Auftrians be-lieve, that he intended to intercept their Com+ munication with their Magazines at Iglaw, or that he defign'd to purfue his March towards them, and that either Supposition might deter-mine them to abandon Teutch-Brod, which they accordingly did the 4th Inftant, having convey'd their Magazines from thence feven or eight Days before, and leaving only a Captain, with near 200 Men in it, who were made Prifoners of War. The Auftrians however are thought only to be removed to Pilgram, and remain, with their main Force, Masters of Budeweis, Tabor and Neuhaus; and Prince Lobcowitz is supposed to have removed his Corps nearer the Great Duke's, in order to fuffain him against Marshal Broglio, who had taken Possellion of Pifeck, and repulied a Detachment of the Great Duke's Army, who had attempted to force that Place. A Party of the Prullians demanded of the Town of Chrudim 40,000 Florins, with Menaces to burn it if the faid Sum was not immediately forth coming; as another of those Troops did, in the fame Manner, at Olmitz, of 200,000.
