Nor shall our most earnest Prayers be ever wanting, that your Majesty may long continue thus to be the Support of the Liberties of Europe, and that in your Majesty and your Posterity, we and our Descendants to latest Ages, may enjoy the Protection of our Religion and Liberties, which no Well-wisher to those invaluable Bleffings can be secure of in any other Hands.

Petersbourg, Nov. 26. On Wednesday last Count Gollowin, High Admiral of Russia, arrived here from Reval. The next Day being the Anniversary of the Order of St. Katherine, instituted by the Empress Katherine, Mother of her present Imperial Majesty, the Empress dined in Publick with the Princess of Hesle Hombourg, who was invested with that Order by the Foundress; and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court on that Occasion. Yesterday being the Anniversary of the Empress's Accession to the Crown, her Imperial Viajesty received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, Nobility, and a great Number of Persons of Distinction, who had the Honour to kiss her Majesty's Hand on that Occasion. The Empress dined in Publick on the Throne, and the Company of Life-Guards, confisting of 360 Men, (who have all the Rank of Lieutenants) had the Honour to dine in the same Room with her Imperial Majesty, who was dress'd in the Unisorm, as Captain of that Company. Several Salvos were given by the Cannon of the Fort and Admiralty, the Bells rung in all the Churches, and in the Evening the whole City was illuminated. The Marquis de la Chetardie arrived here from Stockholm Yesterday in the Afternoon. Her Imperial Majesty has deferred her Departure for Moscow to the Beginning of January.
