Count Elterhafi went to Drefden the Day before Yefterday. It is faid that the Spariiards who were at Civita Caftellane, are retired into the Abruzzo. Marfhal Traun is appointed and declared in Form to fucceed the late Marhal Khevenhuller.

Vienna, Feb. 22, N.S. The Archdutchefs and the Prince received the Compliments of the whole Court and Town the Day before Yefterday. General Botta is confined to his Houfe, and the Counts Wurmbrand and Hardegg, the one Prefident, the other Vice Prefident of the old Aulick Council, are with three other Perfons of lower Rank, conftituted to interrogate him, and to pronounce Sentence upon the Interrogation and the Evidence which has been produced by the Court of Petersbourg.
Copchbagen, Feb. 22. The late Rigour of the Searon has occafioned an Epidemical Illinefs here, accompanied with a Fever, which though not dangerous, is exceedingly troublefome. The King of Denmark has himfelf a Touch of it, and keeps his Chamber on that Account: His Majefty however held his Council Yefterday as ufual, and refted well laft Night.
Copenbagen, Feb. 24.
