King, and putting Our Truft in Al-mighty God, that He will vouch afe a fpecial Bleffing on Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy-Coun-cil, hereby command, That a Publick Faft and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, upon Friday the Fourteenth Day of March next ; that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Par-don of Our Sins; and may, in the molt devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting those heavy Judgments, which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved, and imploring His Bleffing and Affiftance on Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Prosperity to Us, and Our Kingdoms: And We do strictly charge and command; That the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly obferved by all Our loving Subjects in England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation ; and upon Pain of fuch Punifimment, as We may jully inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty. And, for the better and more orderly Solemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bilhops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick Worship ; and to take Care the fame be timely difperfed throughout their refpective Diocefes. WE, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the juft and neceffary War in which We are engaged with the French King, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God, that He will vouch fe a fpecial Bleffing on our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy-Council, hereby command, That a Publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the Thirteenth Day of March next; that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins; and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved, and imploring His Bleffing and Afistance on Our Arms, and for restoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Prosperity, to Us and Our Kingdoms : And we do ftrictly

charge and command, That the faid Publick Faft be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation ; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment, as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That incontinent this Our Proclamation feen, ye pass to the Market Crois of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Sollicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Doubles hereof to the feveral Paroch Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Sixth Day of February, One thousand feven hundred and fixty, in the Thirty-third Year of Our Reign. GOD fave the KING.

TIS Majefly in Council was this Day pleafed to Order, That a like Faft fhould be observed throughout His Kingdom of Ireland, upon Friday the Fourteenth Day of March next, being the Day appointed for the Fait in England. And to that End His Majesty hath thought proper to direct the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland to caufe a Proclamation to be forthwith published in that Kingdom.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Proclamation of the 15th of May last, "For giving Encouragement to Seamen and able bodied Landmen to enter themfelves on board His Majesty's Ships of War; for granting Rewards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal them-" felves ; for pardoning fuch Seamen as have deferted and shall return into the Service : and also for " taking up all ftragling Seamen," hath been pro-longed and extended to the 11th of this Inftant Fe-- And whereas it is judged expedient for bruary; -His Majesty's Service, that the fame should be con-tinued for some Time longer—His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His privy Council, hereby Order, that the faid Time be prolonged and extended from the aforefaid 11th Day of this Inftant February, to the 24th Day of March next; and that the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majefty's aforementioned Procla-mation, be continued to be paid until the faid 24th Day of March next. — Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
