THE SEPTEMBER AGRICULTURAL WAGES REGULATION) ACT, NORTHERN IRELAND, 1939.

NOTICE OF THE MAKING OF AN ORDER.

The Agricultural Wages Board for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that they have made an Order dated the 24th August, 1940, varying for male workers employed in agriculture the minimum rates for time work and fixing minimum overtime rates of wages, the rate of holiday remuneration and fixing minimum piece rates of wages for male workers employed in flax pulling and ordering that the Provision in the Schedule to the Order shall become effective as from 7th October, 1940.

The minimum rates and other provisions of the Order as varied are summarised below and will continue in operation until further notice.

PIECE RATE OF WAGES FOR WORKERS ENGAGED IN FLAX PULLING.

The rates of wages for male workers engaged in Flax Pulling shall be not less than 9d per stook of 12 beets each measuring not less than 24 inches and not more than 30 inches in circumference.

### HOLIDAY REMUNERATION.

The remuneration for a holiday in respect of each period of continuous employment or two months' duration as provided by the Act shall be one-sixth of the respective weekly wages specified above.

#### OVERTIME RATES.

The differential rate of wages for overtime employment, i.e., employment in each week in excess of the hours specified above or on the half holiday shall be not less than one and one-quarter times the hourly rate of wage in respect of each of the first two hours and one and one-half times in respect of each hour's overtime thereafter, calculated in each case to the nearer penny.
