EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

Whereas Sergeant W. Pogue (No. 1289), of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, was, on the 16th day of January, 1934, appointed to be an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the Explosives Act, 1875:

And whereas the said Sergeant W. Pogue is no longer available for the duties of Inspector:

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Baronet, D.L., M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the said Act, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the said Sergeant W. Pogue shall from this date cease to exercise the powers and perform the duties of an Inspector under the said Act.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

In virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the Explosives Act, 1875,

and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Baronet, D.L., M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, hereby appoint Sergeant Jeremiah Davison (No. 3729), of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, as an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the said Act, and do hereby direct him to exercise only such powers and to perform such duties under the said Act as I shall from time to time assign to him.
