Whereas the Council of the County Borough of Belfast, in pursuance of the provisions of the Shops Act, 1912, has submitted for confirmation a Closing Order made by the said Council on the 1st July, 1940 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), fixing the hours on the several days of the week at which all shops in which the trade or business of Hairdresser or Barber is carried on within the boundary of the County Borough of Belfast shall be closed for the serving of customers:

Now, therefore, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, K.G., K.P., Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Shops Act, 1912, do hereby confirm the Closing Order made by the Council of the County Borough of Belfast on the first day of July, 1940, a

copy of which is set out in the Schedule hereto.

SHOPS ACT, 1912.
THE BELFAST SHOPS EARLY CLOSING ORDER, No. 13.
HAIRDRESSERS', BARBERS' AND SHAVING SHOPS.

The Council of the County Borough of Belfast, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Shops Act, 1912, and after due compliance with its provisions, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order, which may be cited as "The Belfast Shops Early Closing Order" (No. 13), applies to all Hairdressers', Barbers' and Shaving Shops in the City and County Borough of Belfast.

2. All shops to which this Order applies shall be closed for serving customers on the several days of the week at and after the following hours, respectively:—

Day of Week.	Closing Hour.
Monday	... 7.30 o'clock p.m.
Tuesday	... 7.30 o'clock p.m.
Wednesday	... 7.30 o'clock p.m.
Thursday	... 7.30 o'clock p.m.
Friday	... 7.30 o'clock p.m.
Saturday	... 8.0 o'clock p.m.
