TRADE BOARDS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923 AND 1939.

SHIRTMAKING TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

The Shirtmaking Trade Board (Northern Ireland) hereby give notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages set out in their Notice N.I.S. (N.22), dated 10th July, 1940.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed variation of minimum rates will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the tenth day of January, 1941. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Shirtmaking Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, Stormont Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.
