Roots, few, about 6 to 7 centimetres long and about 1 to 2 millimetres thick, with a wide, dark coloured bark and a pale central woody core. Odour, strong and reminiscent of *iso*-valeric acid; taste, bitter and somewhat camphoraceous.

Test for Purity. *Ash*, not more than 12 per cent.
