WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 6 of the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Act, 1858, that it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant to order and declare that from a certain time therein to be named two or more districts shall be served by one and the same person as Clerk.

And whereas by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the orders made thereunder and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, the powers of the Lord Lieutenant in this respect became vested in and are now exerciseable by the Governor of Northern Ireland.

And whereas by the Petty Sessions Fees and Administration Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, it is provided that the power of the Governor of Northern Ireland to make an Order declaring that two or more Petty Sessions districts shall be served by one and the same person as Clerk shall be exerciseable in respect of any districts whether they are all situate in the same county or not, and it is thereby further provided that the appointment of a person to be the Clerk of such two or more districts shall, on the first occasion for such appointment in pursuance of the Order, be made by the Governor of Northern Ireland, who shall select for appointment some one of the persons who filled the office of Petty Sessions Clerk in any of those districts

immediately before the coming into force of the Order, or, in the case of the unfitness of all such persons, then some other proper and fit person, and that the salary to be paid to the Clerk so appointed on the first occasion aforesaid for two or more districts shall notwithstanding anything in Section 6 of the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Act, 1858, be such as the Governor of Northern Ireland in his discretion may fix.

Now we, the Lords Justices of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the abovementioned Acts and all other powers us thereunto enabling do hereby order and declare that the Petty Sessions Districts of Trillick, Co. Tyrone, and Irvinestown, Co. Fermanagh, shall from the 1st day of July, 1923, be served by one and the same person as Clerk.

And we do further appoint John Perry, at present Clerk of Petty Sessions for the district of Irvinestown, Co. Fermanagh, to be Clerk of the districts of Trillick, Co. Tyrone, and Irvinestown, Co. Fermanagh.

And we do further fix the salary of the said John Perry as Clerk of both districts at the annual sum of One Hundred and Thirty Pounds.

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOCAL LOANS.

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the said Act, and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things, by any such Order in Council to make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to Ireland as may appear to Him necessary or proper in order to give effect to the provisions of the said Act; and also to make any adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to England or Scotland as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of any change effected by the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order shall come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Miscellaneous Adaptations) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1923, and shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

2. The modifications and adaptations set out in this Order shall have effect as from the date of this Order save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under that Act, and, subject as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland, to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

3.—(1) Where by any enactment relating to services other than Irish services, any Order, regulation, notice or other document is required or authorized to be published in the Dublin Gazette, the enactment, in its application to Northern Ireland shall be construed as requiring or authorizing the publication of the document in the Belfast Gazette instead of in the Dublin Gazette.

(2) Article 7 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 1) Order, 1922, shall cease to have effect.

4.—(1) If under section sixty-three of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, arrangements are made by the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland (in this Article referred to as the Ministry) for the carrying out of the verification or re-verification of local standards of measure and weight in Northern Ireland by officers of the Board of Trade, and by means of comparison with standards approved by the Board of Trade, instead of by means of comparison with the Northern Ireland secondary

standards, the following provisions shall, during the continuance of such arrangements but no longer, have effect, namely:—

(a) The provisions of articles 8, 9 and 10 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1922, so far as they relate to Northern Ireland secondary standards, shall be suspended in their operation;

(b) References in the Acts to the Board of Trade standards shall be construed as references to the standards approved by the Board of Trade for use in lieu of Northern Ireland secondary standards in pursuance of the arrangements made by the Ministry as aforesaid, and the provisions of the Acts relating to the verification or re-verification of local standards shall apply to Northern Ireland accordingly;

(c) Notwithstanding anything in the Acts, the Ministry may by Order direct that all local standards in Northern Ireland shall be verified under this Article on or before such date (not being later than six months after the coming into force of the arrangements made by the Ministry as aforesaid) as the Ministry may think fit, and that the time within which any such local standards are required to be re-verified shall be extended to the date specified in the Order.

(2) This article shall be construed as one with Part III of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1922.

5. Section fifty-five of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act (Ireland), 1877, shall, in its application to the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, have effect so as to enable any ordinary Judge of the Court of Appeal in Northern Ireland to assist in transacting the business of any Division of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland, if, by reason either of the amount of such business or of the absence of a Judge or Judges through illness it is found expedient that such ordinary Judge should so assist.

6. Section twenty of the Superannuation Act, 1834, in its application to any person appointed, whether before or after the date of this Order, to an office in a public department of the Government of Northern Ireland, who, at the time of his appointment was or is in receipt of a superannuation allowance or compensation payable out of the Consolidated Fund or moneys provided by the Parliament of the United Kingdom, such as is mentioned in that section, shall have effect as if the expression "any office in any public department" included an office in a public department of that Government.

RURAL DISTRICT OF ANTRIM.

To the Council of the Administrative County of Antrim; to the Council of the Rural District of Antrim; to the Guardians of the Poor of the Antrim Union; and to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS the Rural District of Antrim situate in the Administrative County of Antrim is now divided into twenty district electoral divisions, named respectively, the Antrim Rural, Antrim Urban, Ballyclare Rural, Ballylinny, Ballynadrentagh, Ballyrobin, Cargin, Connor, Craigarogan, Cranfield, Crumlin, Donegore, Dundesert, Kilbride, Randalstown, Rashee, Seacash, Sharvogues, Shilvodan, and Templepatrick district electoral divisions:

And whereas it is expedient that the said district electoral divisions with the exception of the Antrim Urban, Kilbride, Sharvogues, and Shilvodan district electoral divisions should be altered, and that with respect to the Rural District of Antrim it should be determined as hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of its powers under the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1914, the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland) 1898 to 1922, and by all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry hereby orders and directs as follows, that is to say:

1. This order shall apply to the electors lists and to the register of electors formed out of such lists which comes into force on the 15th day of December, 1923; for the purposes of the election of County and Rural District Councillors from such date as may be necessary for the purposes of the triennial elections of such Councillors for the County of Antrim and Rural District of Antrim respectively, to be held in the year 1924; for the purposes of the Irish Valuation Acts and the lists to be made thereunder from such dates as may be necessary for the preparation of the lists and rate books on which the rates for the year ending the 31st day of March, 1925, will be assessable; and for all other purposes, on, from, and after the first day of April, 1924.

2. The Rural District of Antrim shall be divided into twenty-three district electoral divisions having the names specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this order.

3. The district electoral divisions into which the said Rural District is so divided shall consist of the townlands, parts of townlands, and places set forth by name in column 2 of the schedule to this order opposite to the name of each such district electoral division.

And it is hereby declared that the foregoing provisions of this Order shall in no way affect or be deemed to affect the limits of any area heretofore determined by any Order to be the area of charge upon which any special expenses as defined by Section 232 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, or any other expenses directed by any Act to be defrayed as such special expenses are and shall be chargeable.

And whereas it is expedient that the said district electoral divisions with the exception of the Meenagh and Mountjoy district electoral divisions should be altered, and that with respect to the Rural District of Dungannon it should be determined as hereinafter appearing:

1. This Order shall apply to the electors' lists and to the register of electors formed out of such lists which comes into force on the 15th day of December, 1923; for the purposes of the election of County and Rural District Councillors from such date as may be necessary for the purposes of the triennial elections of such Councillors for the County of Tyrone and Rural District of Dungannon respectively, to be held in the year 1924; for the purposes of the Irish Valuation Acts and the lists to be made thereunder from such dates as may be necessary for the preparation of the lists and rate books on which the rates for the year ending the 31st day of March, 1925, will be assessable; and for all other purposes on, from and after the First day of April, 1924.

2. The Rural District of Dungannon shall be divided into nineteen district electoral divisions having the names specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order.

## THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

## RURAL DISTRICT OF LURGAN.

To the Council of the Administrative County of Armagh; to the Council of the Rural District of Lurgan; to the Guardians of the Poor of the Lurgan Union; and to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS the Rural District of Lurgan, situate in the Administrative County of Armagh, is now divided into ten district electoral divisions, named respectively the Breagh, Brownlows Derry, Carrowbrack, Cornakinnegar, Drumcree, Kernan, Lurgan Rural, Montiaghs, Portadown Rural, and Tartaraghan district electoral divisions:

And whereas it is expedient that the said district electoral divisions should be altered, and that with respect to the Rural District of Lurgan it should be determined as hereinafter appearing:

Now therefore the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of its powers under the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1914, the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1922, and by all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry hereby orders and directs as follows, that is to say:—

1. This Order shall apply to the electors' lists and to the register of electors formed out of such lists which comes into force on the 15th day of December, 1923; for the purposes of the election of County and Rural District Councillors from such date as may be necessary for the purposes of the triennial elections of such Councillors for the County of Armagh and Rural District of Lurgan respectively, to be held in the year 1924; for the purposes of the Irish Valuation Acts and the lists to be made thereunder from such dates as may be necessary for the preparation of the lists and rate books on which the rates for the year ending the 31st day of March, 1925, will be assessable; and for all other purposes on from and after the First day of April, 1924.

2. The Rural District of Lurgan shall be divided into ten district electoral divisions having the names specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order.

3. The district electoral divisions into which the said Rural District is so divided shall consist of the townlands, parts of townlands, and places set forth by name in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order opposite to the name of each such district electoral division.

And it is hereby declared that the foregoing provisions of this Order shall in no way affect or be deemed to affect the limits of any area heretofore determined by any Order to be the area of charge upon which any special expenses as defined by Section 232 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, or any other expenses directed by any Act to be defrayed as such special expenses are and shall be chargeable.
