NOTIFICATION OF A STATE OF WAR WITH BULGARIA.

His Majesty's Government in the United
Kingdom have been informed by the Gov-
ernment of the United States, who were
in charge of British interests in Bulgaria,
that a declaration of war by that country
on Great Britain was announced in the
Bulgarian Parliament on the 13th Decem-
ber. His Majesty's Government have so
far received no official communication to
this effect from the Bulgarian Government,
but in view of the above information it is
hereby notified that a state of war exists
between the two countries as from the 13th
December.
