UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE. · WEEKLY RATES OF AGRICULTURAL CONTRIBUTIONS.

Notice is hereby given that on the sixth day of July, 1942, His Grace the Governor made an Order in the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in pursuance of Section 65 of the Unemployment Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, declaring

applicable to Northern Ireland certain of the provisions contained in an Order entitled the Unemployment Insurance (Contributions) (Agriculture) Order, 1942, made under Section 59 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1935, and Section 8 of the Unemployment Insurance (Agriculture) Act, 1936, passed by the Parliament of the United Kingdom and making certain adaptation of the said provisions.
