The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 70 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, has made orders dated the 28th July, 1942, restricting traffic on certain district roads in the Counties of Antrim and Londonderry.

The Orders in question are entitled (1) the Restriction of Traffic (Goods Vehicle) (County Antrim No. 3) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942, and (2) the restriction of Traffic (Mill Road, Co. Londonderry) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942.
