EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923 TO 1942.

To the Education Authority for the County of Antrim and all other persons interested.

Whereas it is provided in Section 2 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, that the powers and duties of an Education Authority being the Council of a County shall be exercised and performed through regional education committees to be established under schemes framed by the education authority and confirmed by Orders made by the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland (hereinafter caNed "the Ministry") in accordance with the provisions in the said section accordance with the provisions in the said section contained and that any such scheme may be revoked or altered by a subsequent order.

And whereas it is further provided that before any such Order is made the Ministry shall cause the proposed Order to be published for such period and in such manner as the Ministry may consider necessary in order to make the same known to the education authority and all other persons interested and shall consider any objections or representations respecting such proposed Order.

And whereas application has been made to the Ministry by the County Council of the County of Antrim being the education authority under the said Act for the said county to alter the existing scheme constituting the regional education com-mittees for the said county in manner following, that is to say :-

Alter Clause 5 of Part II of the Schedule to the said Scheme by substituting for the words the said Scheme by substituting for the words "one-third of the total number of members of the Committee" therein the words "five members of the Committee" so that the terms of the said Clause shall be ." The quorum of a regional education committee shall be five members of the Committee."

And whereas on the 30th day of July, 1942, notice as in the said Act provided was duly published and given that the Ministry proposed, on the expira-tion of Fourteen days from the date of such Notice, to make an Order altering the said Scheme in accordance with the application aforesaid of the said Education Authority, and that any objections to or representations respecting the said proposed Order must reach the Ministry not later than the 20th August, 1942.

And whereas no such objections to or represen-tations in respect of the said proposed Order have been received by the Ministry.

Now, therefore, the Ministry in virtue of the powers conferred on it by the said Act hereby approves of and confirms the alteration of the said Scheme in manner as aforesaid in accordance with the said application of the Education Authority for the County of Antrim: And the Ministry hereby orders that from and after the date of this Order the alteration hereinbefore specified shall become and form part of the said Scheme, and the said Scheme shall thenceforth be read and construed with the said alteration made therein.
