DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1920-1932.

SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATIONS

(JAMES WILLIAM GILCHRIST).

Whereas, in pursuance of the power conferred on the Minister of Home Affairs by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Raw Opium, Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1929, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, as applied by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1929, the authorisations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poison in accordance with the provisions of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, to be in possession of Raw Opium, Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp, or to manufacture any extract or tincture of Indian Hemp, or any preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies, or to carry on the business of retailing, dispensing or compounding the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies, were, by Notice dated the 9th April, 1937, and published in the Belfast Gazette of the 9th April, 1937, withdrawn from James William Gilchrist, Pharmaceutical Chemist, 147 Antrim Road, Belfast, who had been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:
