*NOTE.—The Residuary Share of Reserved Taxes is the net receipt after deduction of the following:—(a) the estimated cost of Reserved Services; (b) the Northern Ireland Contribution towards Imperial Expenditure; (c) New Land Purchase Annuities (Imperial) and (d) Local Loans Repayments (Imperial). It is paid over by the British Treasury in instalments based on an estimate for the financial year and an adjustment is made when the true Residuary Share has been finally ascertained.

AGRICULTURAL RETURNS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939.

The Ministry of Agriculture, Northern Ireland, hereby gives notice that under Section 1 (2) of the Agricultural Returns Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, every occupier of any agricultural land or the person having the management on behalf of the occupier of any agricultural land in Northern Ireland shall be required to furnish on demand by a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary authorised by the Ministry to act as an enumerator of agricultural statistics, particulars of the acreage under the several crops, the acreage ploughed, the quantity of silage made, numbers of silos, numbers of livestock, numbers of agricultural machinery, numbers of paid workers (male), and quantity of milk produced on such land as at the prescribed day.

ALTERATIONS AND AMENDMENTS.

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of Section 54 of the Medical Act, 1858, the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom have caused to be altered and amended the British Pharmacopœia, 1932, which is printed as authorised by the said Council by Butler & Tanner, Limited, of Frome, and of 19 Ludgate Hill, London, E.C.4, and as so authorised is published for the said Council by Constable & Co., Limited, of 10 and 12 Orange Street, Leicester Square, London, W.C.2, in the particulars set forth in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE.

CONFECTIO SULPHURUS. The Tincture of Orange may be omitted in making this Confection.

EXTRACTUM COLCHICI CORMI LIQUIDUM

(Ext. Colch. Corm. Liq.).

Liquid Extract of Colchicum Corm.

Liquid Extract of Colchicum Corm contains 0.3 per cent. w/v of colchicine (limits, 0.27 to 0.33).

Colchicum Corm, dried in *moderateky fine power*—1,000 grammes.

Alcohol (60 per cent.)—a sufficient quantity.

Exhaust the Colchicum Corm, by percolation with Alcohol (60 per cent.), reserving the first 600 millilitres of the percolate. Remove the alcohol from the remainder of the percolate, and evaporate the residue to a soft extract under reduced pressure at a temperature not exceeding 60 degrees. Dissolve the extract in the reserved liquid. Determine the proportion of colchicine in the liquid, thus obtained, by the Assay described below. To the remainder of the liquid add sufficient Alcohol (60 per cent.) to produce a Liquid Extract of Colchicum Corm of the required strength. Set aside for not less than twenty-four hours; filter, if necessary.

Assay Evaporate 20 millilitres to dryness on a water-bath, and complete the Assay as directed under "Colchici Semen," commencing with the words, "wash the residue into a separator with 20 millilitres of a 20 per cent. w/v aqueous solution of *sodium sulphate* . . ." and including the modification described under "Colchici Cormus."

Preparations. Tinctura colchici.

DOSES.

<i>Metric.</i>	<i>Imperial.</i>
0.12 to 0.3 mil.	2 to 5 minims.

Liquid Extract of Colchicum Corm contains in 0.3 mil. 0.0009 gramme, and in 5 minims about 1/70 grain, of colchicine.

EXTRACTUM COLCHICI LIQUIDUM. When Liquid

Extract of Colchicum is prescribed, or demanded, Liquid Extract of Colchicum Corm may be dispensed, or supplied.

MISTURA SENNAE COMPOSITA. Aromatic Solution of Ammonia may be used, in place of Aromatic Spirit of Ammonia, and a mixture of one part of Concentrated Compound Tincture of Cardamom and three volumes of water may be used, in place of Compound Tincture of Cardamom, in making this Mixture.

PARAFFINUM LIQUIDUM. The requirement "remains clear when dried, cooled to 0 degree, and kept at that temperature for four hours (limit of solid paraffins)" is deleted.

TINCTURA COLCHICI. Liquid Extract of Colchicum Corm may be used, in place of Liquid Extract of Colchicum, in making this Tincture.

TROCHISCI. A mixture of one volume of Concentrated Tincture of Tolu and three volumes of water may be used, in place of Tincture of Tolu, in making Lozenges.

MOTOR VEHICLE LICENCES: HARVESTING
OPERATIONS CONCESSION.

Order, dated 30th November, 1943, made by the Ministry of Finance, under Section 1 of the Finance (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland), 1943:—

1. Where any crop is being harvested upon any land in Northern Ireland, a mechanically-propelled vehicle licensed under sub-division (1) of paragraph 4 of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1920 (which, as amended by the First Schedule to the Finance Act (Northern Ireland), 1937, and subsequent enactments, specifies the rates of duty to be charged on vehicles registered in the name of a person engaged in agriculture and used on roads solely by that person for the purpose of the conveyance of the produce of, or of articles required for the purpose of, the agricultural land which he occupies), may, without further duty, be used (whether by the person in whose name it is registered or not) for the purpose of conveying in the course of such harvesting or of any operations incidental thereto:—

(a) the produce of that land;
(b) any articles required for the purposes of that land.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Vehicle Licences: Harvesting Operations Concession (Northern Ireland) Order, 1943, and shall continue in force until 7th December, 1943.
