CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 TO 1943.

Whereas by Regulations 26 of the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, it is provided that the Civil Authority may by notice prohibit the circulation of any newspaper for any specified period, and that any person circulating or distributing such newspaper within such specified period shall be guilty of an offence against the Regulations in the said Schedule:

Now I, the Right Honourable William Lowry, K.C., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Acts, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 26 of the Regulations made under the authority of the above-mentioned Acts, prohibit the circulation of the following newspapers entitled:—

- "An Phoblacht" or "The Republic" or "The Loyalist" or "The Republican Press."
- "The Irish World and American Industrial Liberator."
- "Fianna."
- "Republican Congress."
- "An Siol" or "The Seed"
- "Saoirse Eireann Wolfe Tone Weekly."
- "Irish Freedom."
- "The Sentry."
- "Red Hand," and
- "The Critic,"

or under any other title or alias whatever in Northern Ireland, from the 1st day of January, 1944, until the 31st day of December, 1944.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 TO 1943.

Whereas certain Regulations for Peace and Order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule

to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (a) for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule, or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable William Lowry, K.C., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, by this Regulation do make further provision for the preservation of Peace and Maintenance of Order, and do hereby, as from the date hereof, revoke Regulation 26 contained in the said Schedule and order that the following Regulation shall be substituted therefor:—

26 (1) If it appears to the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland that the publication, or continued publication, of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular, or other printed matter is prejudicial to, or likely to be prejudicial to, the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland, the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland may by order prohibit for any specified period the publication of any such newspaper, periodical, book, circular, or other printed matter.

(2) If any person shall, within such specified period, print, publish, circulate, or distribute or be in any way concerned in the printing, publication, circulation or distribution of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter, the publication of which has been prohibited under this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE). RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.
